## ABSTARCT

*This paper deals with the implementation and results of Smart surveillance monitoring system using Raspberry pi and PIR sensor for mobile devices. It increases the usage of mobile technology to provide essential security to our homes and for other control applications . The credit card size Raspberry Pi (RPI) with Open Source Computer Vision (OpenCV) software handles the image processing, control algorithms for the alarms and sends captured pictures to user's email via Wi- Fi. As part of its alarm system, it will play the recorded sounds: "intruder" or "smoke detected" when there is a detection. The system uses ordinary webcam but its IR filter was removed in order to have night vision capability .The proposed home security system captures information and transmits it via a 3G Dongle to a Smart phone using web application. Raspberry pi operates and controls motion detectors and video cameras for remote sensing and surveillance, streams live video and records it for future playback. It can also find the number of persons located with the help of the Infrared sensor. For example , when motion is detected, The cameras automatically initiate recording and the Raspberry pi device alerts the owner of the possible intrusion having a smart phone. Raspberry - Pi has two main components interacting with each other: one is the Web Application that executes on the mobile device's browser and server -side scripts that run in a cloud which will be operated by the Raspberry Pi Hardware tool component*

## I. INTRODUCTION

Raspberry pi is a credit- card sized computer .It functions almost as a computer. There are various surveillance systems such as camera ,CCTV etc., In these types of surveillance systems, the person who is stationary and is located in that particular area can only view what is happening in that place .Whereas, here ,even if the user is moving from one place to another ,he/she can keep track of what is happening in that particular place. Raspbian OS has to be installed so that the image can be transmitted to the smartphone Closed-circuit television monitoring system has now become an indispensable device in today's society. Supermarkets, factories, hospitals, hotels, schools, and companies are having their own CCTV system for 24/7 monitoring. It gives real-time monitoring, provides surveillance footage, and allows the authorities have evidences against illegal activities. Although surveillance

camera records video and helps the authorities to identify the cause of an incident such as crime or accident, it is just a passive monitoring device. The researchers developed an active surveillance camera that has the capability of identifying the context of the scene being monitored and able to give notification or alarm as the event happens.

## II. FUNCTIONAL DESCRIPTION

The functions of the various components are given below:

### A. USB Camera:

USB Camera captures the image and sends it to the USB port of the Raspberry Pi board. The camera model used here is USB Camera model 2.0.

### B. Raspberry Pi:

Raspberry pi is a small credit-card sized computer capable of performing various functionalities such as in surveillance systems, military applications, etc. The various functionalities of the components are given below. The various components of Raspberry- Pi are

- *SD Card Slot* is used to install OS/booting/long term storage .The total memory of the SD card is about 8GB.
- *Micro USB Power Port* provides 700mA at 5A. *RCA Video Out* is connected to display if HDMI output is not used. It is mainly used to carry audio and video signals. They are otherwise called as A/V jacks.
- *Audio Out* Digital audio is obtained if HDMI is used to obtain stereo audio. Here analogue RCA connection is used.
- *Ethernet Port* is used to connect to the Internet. It also plays a role in updating, getting new software easier.
- *HDMI OUT(High Definition Multimedia Interface)* is used with HDTVs and monitors with HDMI input. Also HDMI-HDMI is used here.
- *BROADCOM BCM 2835*: It is otherwise defined as System on chip .It is a 700 MHz Processor. It has a Video core IV GPU. *GPIO* allows us to control and interact with real world

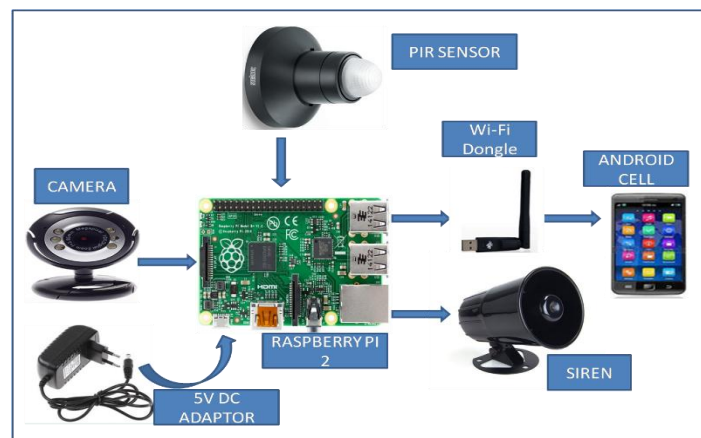


Fig 2. System Design

## II. GENERAL SYSTEM FLOW CHART

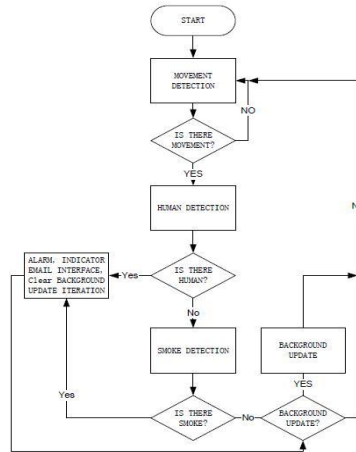


Fig. 3. General System Flowchart

To optimize the algorithm, the researchers separate the algorithm into three parts which are motion detection, human detection and smoke detection. If there is no motion detected, the program will not go to human detection and smoke detection algorithm. Otherwise, if motion is detected, the current frame of detected motion will be processed by human detection algorithm. If the moving object is identified as non-human object, the smoke detection algorithm will be activated. If there is a detection of either human or smoke, alarm, LED indicators and email interface function will be activated. General system flowchart is shown in Figure 3.

The Raspberry Pi primarily uses Linux kernel-based operating systems (it is not possible to run Windows on the Raspberry Pi). The ARM11 is based on version 6 of the ARM on which several popular versions of Linux no longer run (in current releases), including Ubuntu. The install manager for Raspberry Pi is NOOBS. The OSs included with NOOBS are:

Arch linux ARM Open ELEC

Pidora (Fedora Remix) Raspbmc and the XBMC open source digital media center

RISC OS – The operating system of the first ARM-based computer

Raspbian (recommended) – Maintained independently of the Foundation; based on the ARM hard-float(armhf) Debian 7 'Wheezy' architecture port originally designed for ARMv7 and later processors (with Jazelle RCT/ThumbEE, VFPv3, and NEON SIMD extensions), compiled for the more limited ARMv6 instruction set of the Raspberry Pi. A minimum size of 2 GB SD card is required, but a 4 GB SD card or above is recommended. There is a Pi Store for exchanging programs.

- The Raspbian Server Edition is a stripped version with other software packages bundled as compared to the usual desktop computer oriented Raspbian.

The Wayland display server protocol enable the efficient use of the GPU for hardware accelerated GUI drawing functions Raspbian for Robots - A fork of Raspbian for robotics projects with LEGO, Grove, and Arduino

## V.STEPS FOR THE PuTTY CONFIGURATION

1. Obtain a copy of PuTTY pre-configured for use at Columbia from the PuTTY download page.
2. Save the installer file to your download directory or desktop.

**Important: Exit all applications before you begin the installation process.**

3. Double-click on the file PuTTY-install.exe to begin the installation.
4. At the **Choose Destination** screen, Click **Next** to accept the recommended default destination location for installing PuTTY.
5. Click **Next on the Select Program Folder** screen to select PuTTY as the recommended Program Folder name (**PuTTY** should already be displayed in the Program Folders text box).
6. Click **Finish** on the final screen to complete the installation.

- 3.Download WINDISK 32 utility from source forge project which is a zip file.
- 4.Extract and run the zip file.
- 5.Select the file and click run as administrator.
- 6.Select the image file which was extracted above.
- 7.Select the drive letter of the SD card in the device box.
- 8.Click write and wait for write process to complete.
- 9.Exit the image and eject the SD card.

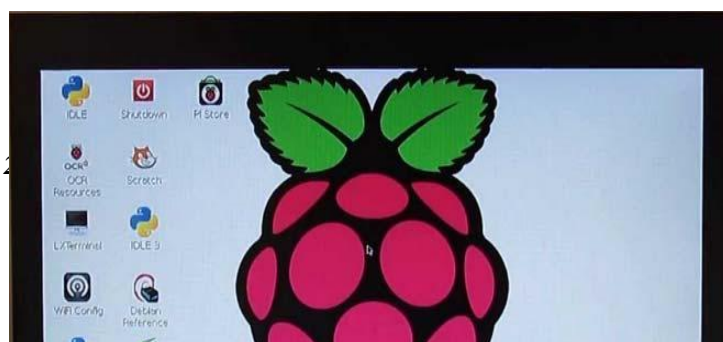


Fig 6:Installed Raspbian OS

Once you have an operating system running here are the required steps to install a VNC server:

- 1.Open LX terminal.
2. In LX terminal type in "sudo apt-get update" to update the operating system to the latest version.
3. When prompted to update type in "y" and press enter.
4. After updating is complete type in "sudo install tight vncserver". Press "y" and hit enter when prompted
5. Once tight VNC server has completed installation you can start it by typing in "vncserver:1"
6. It will prompt you to create a password. Keep in mind passwords can be at MOST 8 characters long.
7. Enter a password .The VNC server is now running in the background of your Raspberry Pi's operating system. We use any computer on your network with a VNC client to remotely access the Raspberry Pi.

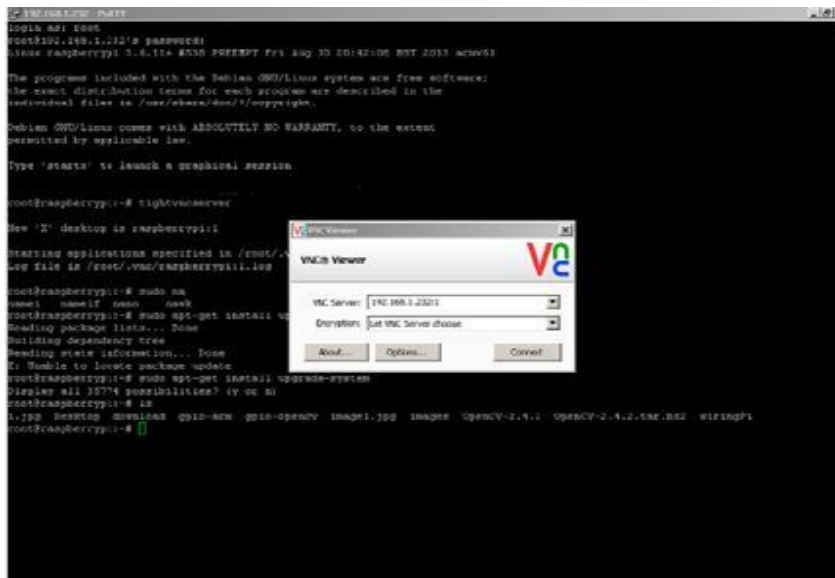


Fig 7. VNC Viewer Installed

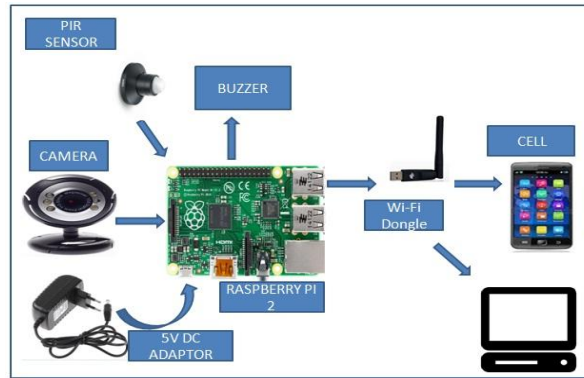

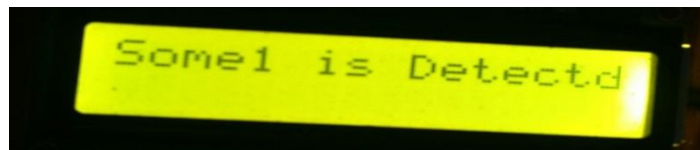


Figure12. Shows that someone is detected. Means someone person is in room.
